



GE is an advanced technology, services, and finance company taking on the world's toughest challenge. Dedicated to innovation in energy, health, transportation, and infrastructure, GE operates in more than 100 countries and employs more than 300,000 people worldwide.

The company traces its beginnings to Thomas Alva Edison, who established Edison Electric Light Company in 1878. A merger of Edison General Electric Company and Thomson-Houston Electric Company in 1892 created General Electric Company. GE is the only company listed in the Dow Jones Industrial Index today that was also included in the original index in 1896.

GE in Indonesia

GE has been present in Indonesia since 1940. Today, GE's investment in Indonesia has reached more than US\$1.2 billion, and more than its 700 Indonesian employees serve customers in the country. GE also offers a unique opportunity for Indonesian manufacturers to be world-class suppliers through GE's global sourcing program.

GE's product and services are key to customers such as Garuda Indonesia, PLN, Pertamina, and Kereta Api (PT KA), as well as cities such as Jakarta, Surabaya and Bogor which rely on GE for their street lighting. GE Capital provides financing for infrastructure development in Indonesia's airline and power sectors. GE Healthcare's medical imaging equipment is installed in major hospitals and clinics around the country.

GE water purification technology, which was the backbone of the drinking water supply in Aceh during critical post-tsunami months, is one of several industrial water solutions offered by GE Water and Process Technologies. One of the two donated units has been in service to help the earthquake survivors in West Sumatera and Yogyakarta post-Merapi eruptions.

GE's ecomagination initiative aims to meet customers' demand for energy-efficient, less emissive products by doubling GE's R&D in clean technologies, increase revenues from ecomagination products & services, reduce its greenhouse gas emissions and improve energy efficiency of its operations.

GE's healthmagination initiative leverages innovation to help improve the quality of healthcare, reduce its cost, and improve the access.

In 2007, Wired magazine ranked GE in the top ten companies for starting a "green revolution" by having clean technology businesses ranging from wind turbines, hybrid rail engines, water systems, and coal gasification.

Giving back to the community

Contributing back to the communities around us is very important to GE. Each year, the GE Family provides more than US\$150 million in cash, products and services to support local and global services organizations around the world. GE's Scholar-Leader scholarship programs provides support for Indonesian students, and beyond formal education, GE also support Junior Achievement programs, Early Learning Development program, and teacher empowerment programs. GE also donates medical equipment as part of its Developing Health Globally™ program, and continue its partnership with Habitat for Humanity to provide homes for underprivileged families. GE also contributed to the lighting of historical monuments such as Borobudur and Prambanan temples.

GE Volunteers actively carry out many projects to benefit communities around their workplace: from rebuilding homes in Banda Aceh and West Java, to mentoring inner-city children in Jakarta, and drive green education programs, partnering with local schools for environmental projects.
