What is the job application process?

Applying online for a job at GE is simple:

- Visit GE's [job search page](#)
- Click on the "Start Your Job Search" button
- You can focus your search by selecting roles in the state of "Michigan" and city of "Van Buren Township"
- Complete your online registration
- Enter your resume (CV) in the GE format
- Complete the questionnaire
- Submit your online application
