Fair Employment Practices, including prohibiting discrimination, harassment and retaliation in your business operations; and

Human Rights, including respecting the human rights of your employees and others in your business operations and your activities.

GE will only do business with Suppliers who comply with the Guide's requirements and who do not engage in any form of discrimination. We hope that you see the value of these standards and are committed to upholding them in your organization. Together, I am confident we can drive positive, lasting change. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.
